On July 19, 2021, the Court ruled on the Joint Motion of The Parties for Relief from the Final Judgment Under Rule 60 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure Solely to the Extent Necessary to Include 216 Additional Individuals in the California Disclosure Subclass. (*See* ECF No. 288). In furtherance of the Court's ruling, the Court **GRANTS** the Parties' Joint Motion and **ORDERS** that: :

1. The Parties will cause the Settlement Administrator to send notice of the class action settlement to the Omitted Individuals by August 2, 2021. The Omitted Individuals will have thirty days from the date the notice program begins to

1 file objections to the Settlement or opt out of the Settlement. The notice will be
2 substantially in the form of the notice attached as Exhibit 1 to the Settlement
3 Agreement, with such changes as are necessary to reflect the modifications to the
4 Final Judgment requested by the Parties' motion.


5 2. The Court will set a continued fairness hearing for September 13, 2021
6 at 8:30 a.m.

7 3. The Payment Deadline will be extended for all California Class
8 Members and all Class Representatives to October 4, 2021.

9 4. Except to the extent specifically requested in the Rule 60(b) motion
10 (which would be as stated above), the Final Judgment and Order would remain in
11 full force and effect and unchanged. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. 60(c)(2) ("The [Rule 60]
12 motion does not affect the judgment's finality or suspend its operation.").
